SPOT SIGNS OF PHISHING

To prevent yourself from becoming a victim of phishing scams, learn to spot signs of phishing. Look out for mismatched information such as website and email addresses that are misleading. Be wary of messages that you are not expecting, especially if they ask for your personal information, and with urgent 'calls to action'.



Remember: You should not reveal your personal information to strangers over the phone. When in doubt, seek the advice of your family or a trusted adult.



UPDATE YOUR SOFTWARE PROMPTLY

Software and apps updates contain important security fixes that can help keep your devices safe. For convenience, enable automatic updates, or schedule updates to install overnight when your device is plugged in.





SET STRONG PASSWORDS AND ENABLE TWO FACTOR AUTHENTICATION (2FA)

Create a strong password with:

- At least 12 characters
- · Uppercase and lowercase letters
- Numbers and symbols



Enable 2FA as an extra layer of protection, which can be in the form of a code sent to your phone or biometrics (e.g. your fingerprint).

Do not use your persona information (e.g. name, birthdate, NRIC) in your



Never share your passwords and OTI with others



If you suspect that your account has been compromised, change your password immediately.



USE AN ANTI-VIRUS SOFTWARE

Install a reputable anti-virus software on your devices to scan and remove malware and block unsafe websites.
